Story of Redemption

Mike (not his real name) grew up in Winnipeg. That's where all his family still lives today.

Mike got involved in the wrong crowd as a teenager and his life went in a direction he did not expect. Eventually he ended up serving time in prison. Mike served his sentence in B.C. and when he got out, he didn't know anyone in the area. His parole officer told him about NOLA, and he thought he might as well give it a shot. He met with Program Leader Christian, and they quickly hit it off. They would go for walks, coffees and Christian even took him out to the movies. "I am so excited - I haven't been to the movies in years and with only getting 28 dollars a week right now I cannot afford to go on my own," said Mike. Mike is currently applying for full parole and is planning to go back to live with family in Winnipeg. Mike said,

"Having someone to talk to as a support made a big difference for me - they even gave me a Christmas gift from a volunteer who I have never even met. It was the only gift I got this Christmas, and it really meant a lot. I am so thankful for the NOLA Program!"

With Mike hopefully heading back to Winnipeg, we celebrate and pray for his continued life change!
